


Volcanoes Around the World




I buried the ancient Roman city of Pompeii in ash and pumice in 79 CE. People living near me today are in danger because I am still active! Who am I?




I live in Costa Rica and was active for 42 years until 2010. Tourists used to watch my glowing lava displays at night.

Who am I?




I am in Guatemala and visitors often roast marshmallows using my hot rocks. You can sometimes hike close enough to see my flowing lava.

Who am I?




I am the world's most active volcano and am home to Pele, the Hawaiian goddess of fire. I erupted continuously for 35 years (1983-2018).

Who am I?




I am the largest volcano on Earth, covering half of "The Big Island" in the Pacific. If measured from my base deep under the ocean, I'm taller than Mount Everest!

Who am I?




I surprised everyone when I erupted after centuries of quiet in the Caribbean, covering its island's capital in ash and forcing most of its people to leave.

Who am I?




I suddenly rose from a Mexican cornfield in the 40s, grew rapidly, and left behind a lava-covered village where only a church tower remains visible.
