

Coloring Activity: All About Drums




I am a goblet-shaped drum from West Africa, played with bare hands and tuned with ropes. My name comes from a Bambara saying meaning "everyone gather together in peace," which perfectly describes my purpose in community gatherings. I have a wide rim and narrow base, and my skin head produces both deep bass tones and sharp slaps.


I have an hourglass shape with two heads of different sizes, making me look like I'm wearing a hat that's too big on one end! I'm sacred to the Yoruba people and traveled from Nigeria to Cuba, where I became important in Santería ceremonies. I'm played with hands and sticks, and I can "talk" through my complex rhythms.




I am tall and barrel-shaped with a single drumhead, and I usually come with friends! So, you'll rarely see just one of me! I was born in Cuba among enslaved people of African origin, and now I'm essential in salsa, mambo, and Latin jazz. Players use their hands to create my deep, resonant tones.




I'm the smaller cousin of another Cuban drum, and I always come in pairs - one higher-pitched, one lower. You'll usually see me nestled between a player's knees, played with fingertips and palms. I'm essential in son cubano, salsa, and Latin music, providing crisp, sharp rhythms.



I am made of wooden percussion sticks rather than drums, but I'm absolutely essential to Afro-Caribbean music. I consist of two hardwood sticks that are struck together to create a sharp, penetrating sound. I originated in Cuba and provide the fundamental rhythmic pattern for salsa, rumba, mambo, and other Latin music styles. I am the heartbeat of Cuban music.

I started life as an oil drum but was transformed into something musical and beautiful in the 1930s. I'm the national instrument of Trinidad and Tobago, played with rubber mallets, and I can perform everything from calypso to classical music. My surface is hammered into different pitched sections.
